

JEFFREY HESSING: PROVENCE

The sunlit vistas of Provence and its southeastern coast, the Riviera, are lush with color and rich with a sense of antiquity. Nowhere else on Earth has civilization tamed the land so beautifully. Sculpted with walls and terraces, and painted with the hues of orchards, gardens, and fields of lavender, the Provincia Romana of the Caesars is a work of art in itself. While the Riviera has become a symbol of modern glamour, little else has changed since Matisse, Cezanne, Chagall, Bonnard, Vuillard, Van Gogh, Dufy, Picasso and Braque traveled in the region in search of inspiration.

Inland on the Riviera, in the hills above the Baie des
Anges, lies the medieval village of Vence. For the past two
decades, American painter Jeffrey Hessing has made his
home in Vence, not far from the former residence of Matisse.
Hessing's work lies within the artistic traditions of southern
France, yet remains vibrantly contemporary. The freshness
and energy of Matisse and Cezanne, the balance and
simplicity of Japanese painting and the pure color and
exuberance of Abstract Expressionism are strongly present
on Hessing's canvases.


Working in oil on colored gesso, Hessing relies on color for emotive expression, while paying careful attention to both draftsmanship and composition. By painting on a red, yellow, blue or plum ground, he creates unity and mood, effectively capturing the brilliant heat of noon, the descent of twilight or the cool shadows of an interior.

"Red Summer" (cat#4) is the artist's response to the intense heat of Provence at that season. It was painted outdoors, in full sun and at 95 degrees. Bold strokes of green, blue and black contrast sharply with the brilliant red ground. Glowing with fiery orange and white-hot gold, this painting opens a window on an eternal summer. Hessing's spring landscape, "Multicolored Sky" (cat#6) unfolds above a hillside dense with red-roofed cottages, olives and poplars. Green, lavender, turquoise and yellow hues are as beautifully balanced as those on a butterfly's wing. Hessing has described his work on this painting as "a moment of grace - as spontaneous as a Haiku poem from beginning to end."


Hessing's interiors express the spirit of a region where elegance comes naturally, and where every aspect of life - art, food, wine, conversation - is to be savored. Within the light's crystal clarity, domestic objects bloom with a special radiance. In Hessing's "Tulips" (cat#32), the red and yellow flowers on gracefully arching stems, the polished mahogany dresser, the creamy surface of the wall and the translucent print curtain gain new depth and beauty, thanks to the painter's sensitive interpretation.


Like all artists Hessing strives to capture the inner spirit of the outer world, observed through the medium of his soul and spirit. His works express the joy of discovery, of risks taken and dreams realized, and of being thrilled with life. How could an artist flourish in Provence and feel otherwise?




- 4. Red Summer, 1998 25 1/2 x 32", JH350
- 5. Summer Sun, 1998 25 1/2 x 32", JH351








- 7. Hot Afternoon in Provence, 1998 34 3/4 x 51 1/2", JH361


- Olive Tree in Autumn, 1997






















19. Two Cypresses, 1998








21. Terrace on Provence, 1998















27. Pool House, 1994


