Onda Yaki

Onda Yaki is a collection of Japanese Folk Pottery. Onda Sarayama was founded as a potting community in 1705 and little has changed about the process and aesthetics of ceramic production since that time. Clay slip decoration, chatter marking, drip and wipe glazing are all decorative techniques that have survived. Currently, ten of the fourteen families inhabiting the area participate in pottery production, and all pieces are still fired in a noborigama (climbing kiln). Onda ceramics fulfill all the necessary requirements of the best utilitarian wares. They are made by welltrained, highly skilled potters working in a traditional mode, using local materials and techniques that have been passed down for generations. The works are straightforward and honest, and combine solid and restrained shapes with a variety of decorative methods executed in a limited palette of colored glazes.


